






Vernon Celebrates the Holidays with Huntington Park

Transit Service Study

In a continued effort to best meet the transportation and mobility needs of the residents, employees, and visitors to our City, we are studying the feasibility of a local shuttle or other transit service in our City. We want to know your thoughts on current transit services, areas for improvement and other transportation concepts that may be important to you and our community. This study is being sponsored by the Southern California Association of Governments' (SCAG) Sustainability Planning Grant Program.

Each Vernon resident is invited to complete a survey designed to assess opinions on transit service. Each includes a postage paid envelope and all information will be kept confidential and used for analysis purposes only. We encourage your participation and hope that you will provide valuable feedback for the City to use at it moves forward with planning for the current and future needs of its residents.

Vernon CommUNITY Fund Introduces Scholarship Program for High School Seniors



After much planning and coordination, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund (VCF) is proud to announce that it has launched a pilot scholarship program for Vernon Area high school seniors who are committed to investing in their education for a brighter future. City-Owned Housing Rental Rates Adjusted

The Vernon Housing Commission approved a rental increase on City-Owned rental units at their December 12th meeting. Rental rates for existing tenants will be increased by 1% effective March 1, 2019. Rates for new tenants will be increased to be aligned with current Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Fair Market Rents for similar properties in the local area.

When incidences of unit transfers and temporary relocations to accommodate remodels occur, rates will not be impacted.
