Background:

As one of the key elements of the City's good governance reforms, the City Council created the Vernon CommUNITY Fund ("VCF") to provide grants to charitable and governmental entities for projects and programs that benefit those residing and working in Vernon. Given the exclusively industrial nature of Vernon, the City Council determined that the VCF was in the best interest of the City and its residents, businesses, and workers.

The City retained the services of Jemmott Rollins Group, Inc. ("JRG") to provide consultation, guidance, research and specialized administrative support services to the City Administrator and City staff related to the VCF. JRG has extensive experience in non-profit grant-making and grants management and specialized knowledge of ethics and principles governing the grant-making process.

On February 4, 2014, the City Council established the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee ("Grant Committee") and provided the basic guidelines and operational procedures for said Committee and its officers, including those related to the allocation of funds and the processes for reviewing and ranking applications and awarding grants.

Fiscal Year 2020/2021 Funding

Pursuant to Vernon Municipal Code (VMC) Section 2.164, the City Council may appropriate funds to the VCF. Through the normal budgetary process, City Council authorized an amount of \$500,000 to the VCF for fiscal year 2020/2021. The Grant Committee is required to allocate funds for fiscal year 2020/2021 in accordance with the following formula:

- (a) Administrative Costs shall be determined for the fiscal year and the amount shall be allocated for payment from funds appropriated to the VCF.
- (b) The remainder of available funds in any fiscal year may be awarded to proposals to expend funds on direct services and/or scholarship grants. No single grant of this type shall be in an amount more than \$250,000.

In consideration of Administrative Costs of \$106,675, the total maximum amount of grant funds available for award to proposals for direct services and/or scholarship grants during Fiscal Year 2020/2021 is \$373,325. At its November 18, 2020 meeting, the VCF Grant Committee approved an allocation in the amount of \$20,000 toward the VCF Scholarship Program. As such, JRG and City staff recommend the Grant Committee award \$20,000 in scholarship grants in the specified amounts to the individual students identified in this staff report.

Criteria for Ranking Scholarship Grant Applicants

Pursuant to VMC Section 2.166, all eligible scholarship applicants must be ranked using the following:

Award Criteria (not in order of priority)

- (1) Financial need
- (2) Academic achievement
- (3) Community/extracurricular involvement
- (4) Leadership at school or in the community
- (5) Awards and recognition
- (6) Personal and/or family attributes, as demonstrated through scholarship application process

FY 2020/2021 Scholarship Grant Applications

As previously indicated, there are six (6) FY 2020/2021 Scholarship grant candidates presented for review, deliberation, and award by the Grant Committee. All applicants meet the eligibility requirements set forth in VMC Section 2.165 and all applications were thoroughly vetted by JRG and City staff using the aforementioned ranking criteria.

Based on the application criteria, due diligence findings, and the amount of funding available, the total amount of scholarship grant funding recommended for Fiscal Year 2020/2021 is \$20,000.

Recommended scholarship recipient information is summarized in each evaluation form attached hereto as Attachment 1. These materials and recommendations are to be used only as guiding documents for the Grant Committee's deliberation. The Grant Committee is expected to debate the content of each application at its May 19, 2021 meeting. The full applications are publicly available and can be accessed at the City Clerk's Office at Vernon City Hall, or via the City's website www.CityofVernon.org wherein grant applicant information is posted online in "Public Meetings" under the "Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee (VCFGC)" link.

Fiscal Impact:

The Fiscal Year 2020/2021 Docket II total recommended scholarship grant award amount of \$20,000 is included in the 2020/2021 City Budget and is within the recommended allocation of \$20,000 for scholarship grants.

I. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Guidelines

The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program focuses on 12th grade students living in the Vernon Area (which includes the cities of Vernon, Maywood, Bell, Huntington Park, Commerce, the area within the City of Los Angeles known as Boyle Heights, and the unincorporated area known as East Los Angeles).

Scholarship Criteria

Vernon Municipal Code ("VMC") Section 2.166(a)(vi) sets forth the specific selection criteria for scholarship recipients and will be the specific standards used to identify qualified applicants who, ultimately, will be recommended as scholarship recipients. Selection criteria have been identified to clearly define the profile of the scholarship recipient.

Many factors will be considered when evaluating scholarship applicants. Scholarship criteria include an applicant's financial need, academic achievement, and the geographic distribution of scholarships. The scholarship criteria support the purpose of the Vernon CommUNITY Fund, which was established to provide charitable contributions in support of improved quality of life, strengthening of families, and affirmation of Vernon's ties with neighboring communities in pursuit of bright futures. The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program was created to provide disadvantaged youth in the Vernon Area the opportunity to achieve success in their post-secondary educational endeavors.

Award Criteria

- Financial need (30 points)
- Community/extracurricular involvement and leadership (30 points)
- Academic achievement (20 points)
- Awards and recognition (10 points)
- Personal and/or family attributes and values (10 points)

Eligibility

12th grade students enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution with full-time status who reside in the Vernon Area (as defined above) may submit an application for a Vernon CommUNITY Fund (VCF) Scholarship.

Specific eligibility standards are identified within this section. In order to be considered for award, applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following detailed criteria:

- Graduating High School Senior
- Achievement of a Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.0 in high school level coursework for trade school or two-year College applicants; or Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 in high school level coursework for four-year College/University applicants at the time of VCF Scholarship application submission



- Pursuit of a two-year or four-year Degree from accredited College/University; or pursuit of Trade School Certification
- Full-time enrollment at post-secondary educational institution of choice (minimum of 12 units for college) at the time of award
- Immediate transition into a post-secondary educational institution upon graduation from high school (must begin post-secondary coursework within 6 months of graduation)
- Residency in the Vernon Area (U.S. Citizenship is <u>not</u> required); minimum Area residency of 12 months
- Demonstration of strong leadership skills and responsibility (successfully communicated in scholarship application)
- Active in extracurricular activities (i.e., school/community involvement/employment/internship)
- A minimum of 20 hours of community service from 9th grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Not a City of Vernon employee or a legal dependent of a City of Vernon employee, Vernon City-appointed official, or Vernon City-elected official

Application Procedures

The information requested on the application is a reflection of the selection criteria designated for the VCF Scholarship Program. The following question and answer section (Q&A) addresses issues related to the VCF Scholarship application process:

- **Q:** Where and when are scholarship applications available?
- **A:** Beginning on January 1st of each year, applications will be available on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website: www.vernoncommunityfund.org
- **Q:** Where should scholarship applications be submitted?
- A: Students may submit their complete application packages to the Vernon City Hall City Administration Office. Contact information is available on the website if any questions or technical issues arise during the application submission process.
- **Q:** When are scholarship applications due?
- **A:** The Vernon CommUNITY Fund will accept scholarship applications through the last Thursday in March.
- Q: What additional information/documents must accompany the scholarship application?
- As per the eligibility criteria noted above, students must submit proof that they reside and have resided for at least 12 months in the Vernon Area (e.g. utility bills); most recent report card; evidence of GPA with high school transcripts; sworn statement (found on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website in scholarship applicant package) of a teacher or program director/supervisor with knowledge that applicant has performed the minimum amount of community service; and evidence of extracurricular activities. Although not required, students may also include letter(s) of recommendation, and/or letter(s) from post-secondary educational institution(s) along with their scholarship application.



Q: How and when will the scholarship award winners be notified?

A: Scholarship grant applicants recommended for award will be reviewed at the regular VCF Grant Committee meeting in May. Applicants selected for award will be notified within one week of scholarship award via email.

Q: How and when will the scholarship awards be disbursed?

A: Award disbursement will occur in June, with checks directly mailed to scholarship grantees.

The VCF Grant Committee retains the right to withhold scholarship grants in any given year if no candidate is determined to be qualified.

Additional Considerations

- Scholarship amount will be based on applicant competition and funds available for award
- Personal interview of scholarship applicant may or may not be required, and shall be determined after initial review of applicant pool
- Applications may be summarily denied, with or without prior notification to the applicant, if any statements or representations in the application and supporting materials are found to be untruthful, dishonest, or misleading

Selection Procedures

Procedures for selection of award will mirror the current process used for the award of direct service grants and capital grants through the Vernon CommUNITY Fund. The initial evaluation of a scholarship application will be a joint effort amongst City staff and consultant, Jemmott Rollins Group (JRG). Ultimately, the application of any candidate(s) recommended for award will be brought to the Vernon CommUNITY Grant Committee in May for deliberation and approval(s) of grant(s).

The VCF Scholarship Program is designed to benefit a broad class of beneficiaries through an objective process that is nondiscriminatory in nature.



II. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Timeline

A VCF Scholarship Program Timeline has been established based upon the calendar year. In summary, applications are accepted beginning January 1st through the last Thursday in March of a given year. In May, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee will select scholarship grantees. Funds for scholarship awards will be dispersed in June to all scholarship grant recipients.

January – March

Window to receive candidate applications for VCF Scholarship Program

April

Review of candidate applications to determine recommended grant awards for VCF Grant Committee approval

May

Approval of VCF Scholarship Grant Awards at the regular May VCF Grant Committee Meeting (held on the 3^{rd} Wednesday in May at 10:00 a.m.)

June

VCF Scholarship Grant Awards are processed for payment

I am so fortunate to have her in my life and I want her to know that all of her sacrifices were worth it. Her catching the 4 am bus at the bus stop down the street to get to school and every hour that she stayed up studying preparing for her exams during college, while at the same time carrying me, was worth it. Taking my little brother and me with her to class at UCLA because there was no one else that could take care of us, was worth it. The ambitious and determined adolescent that I am is a product of her hard work and dedication. We may have the same name, but we have not faced the same obstacles in life. I will never be able to fully understand the various difficulties she had to overcome as a young mom pursuing postsecondary education, but I understand why receiving higher education is so important.

Through my experiences as a female Mexican-American student, I grew up realizing that life for minorities and women, like my mother, came with so many expected and unexpected obstacles. Many of the women that raised me and that I was surrounded by as a little girl, carried not just the weight of the household tasks and children, but also the discrimination of sexism. Over time, I learned that these women had had their own dreams and goals for their future, but they were held back by those that were ignorant of the fact that women are also capable of being successful. The impact of these firsthand experiences are what have influenced my current educational and career goals. I am proud to be a young, Latina and because of this, I aspire to be part of the wave of women in my generation that pursue an education in STEM. My educational

goals as of now begin with me graduating as the valedictorian of my senior class. After high school, I plan on attending a four-year university where I will major in biomedical engineering with a minor in computer science. At my future university, my goals are to get an internship and gain research experience within my major. Moving forward into my higher education, the highest degree that I plan on pursuing is my doctorate degree. I am determined to keep studying even after I receive my doctorate so that I can further develop my skills and create positive connections with others. My greatest career goal is to become a biomedical engineer. I would like to work in third world countries so that I can bring new technological advancements, help create solutions to health issues, and change the cost of healthcare for those that have been deprived of medical treatment. Ultimately, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program will assist me throughout my journey as I work towards achieving my educational goals. This scholarship will provide me with the opportunity to be more selective in the university that I choose to attend. There are many students that limit themselves when it comes to their post-secondary education and goals because the financial aspect of it is a huge burden. It will increase my chances of continuing into graduate school while relieving some of the financial barriers.

From a young age, I started helping out my community and volunteering at events that they provided for those in need. It began with my curiosity about the well-being of those in my community. My family faced near homelessness when both my brother and I were little kids. 



I. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Guidelines

The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program focuses on 12th grade students living in the Vernon Area (which includes the cities of Vernon, Maywood, Bell, Huntington Park, Commerce, the area within the City of Los Angeles known as Boyle Heights, and the unincorporated area known as East Los Angeles).

Scholarship Criteria

Vernon Municipal Code ("VMC") Section 2.166(a)(vi) sets forth the specific selection criteria for scholarship recipients and will be the specific standards used to identify qualified applicants who, ultimately, will be recommended as scholarship recipients. Selection criteria have been identified to clearly define the profile of the scholarship recipient.

Many factors will be considered when evaluating scholarship applicants. Scholarship criteria include an applicant's financial need, academic achievement, and the geographic distribution of scholarships. The scholarship criteria support the purpose of the Vernon CommUNITY Fund, which was established to provide charitable contributions in support of improved quality of life, strengthening of families, and affirmation of Vernon's ties with neighboring communities in pursuit of bright futures. The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program was created to provide disadvantaged youth in the Vernon Area the opportunity to achieve success in their post-secondary educational endeavors.

Award Criteria

- Financial need (30 points)
- Community/extracurricular involvement and leadership (30 points)
- Academic achievement (20 points)
- Awards and recognition (10 points)
- Personal and/or family attributes and values (10 points)

Eligibility

12th grade students enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution with full-time status who reside in the Vernon Area (as defined above) may submit an application for a Vernon CommUNITY Fund (VCF) Scholarship.

Specific eligibility standards are identified within this section. In order to be considered for award, applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following detailed criteria:

- Graduating High School Senior
- Achievement of a Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.0 in high school level coursework for trade school or two-year College applicants; or Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 in high school level coursework for four-year College/University applicants at the time of VCF Scholarship application submission



Q: How and when will the scholarship award winners be notified?

A: Scholarship grant applicants recommended for award will be reviewed at the regular VCF Grant Committee meeting in May. Applicants selected for award will be notified within one week of scholarship award via email.

Q: How and when will the scholarship awards be disbursed?

A: Award disbursement will occur in June, with checks directly mailed to scholarship grantees.

The VCF Grant Committee retains the right to withhold scholarship grants in any given year if no candidate is determined to be qualified.

Additional Considerations

Scholarship amount will be based on applicant competition and funds available for award

 Personal interview of scholarship applicant may or may not be required, and shall be determined after initial review of applicant pool

 Applications may be summarily denied, with or without prior notification to the applicant, if any statements or representations in the application and supporting materials are found to be untruthful, dishonest, or misleading

Selection Procedures

Procedures for selection of award will mirror the current process used for the award of direct service grants and capital grants through the Vernon CommUNITY Fund. The initial evaluation of a scholarship application will be a joint effort amongst City staff and consultant, Jemmott Rollins Group (JRG). Ultimately, the application of any candidate(s) recommended for award will be brought to the Vernon CommUNITY Grant Committee in May for deliberation and approval(s) of grant(s).

The VCF Scholarship Program is designed to benefit a broad class of beneficiaries through an objective process that is nondiscriminatory in nature.



II. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Timeline

A VCF Scholarship Program Timeline has been established based upon the calendar year. In summary, applications are accepted beginning January 1st through the last Thursday in March of a given year. In May, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee will select scholarship grantees. Funds for scholarship awards will be dispersed in June to all scholarship grant recipients.

January - March

I was in kindergarten when my abuelito was diagnosed with Alzheimer's.

Like many Mexican-American families living in the United States, I grew up under the same roof as my grandparents, uncles, aunts, and cousins. Because I was raised in a multigenerational home, I witnessed my *abuelito's* diagnosis progress firsthand. I saw how defensive he would get when it came to money. More often than not, his frustrated debates with my dad and uncle would end in fistfights. During this time, my family was keen on reminding me that I was supposed to love my *abuelito*, but I was more scared of him than anything. I was too young to understand why he had become so short-tempered and why his eyes looked like they were clinging on to life.

As the years passed, I became better at recognizing the other side of him, the real him. Although the experiences were very sporadic, I had just enough good times with him to miss the grandfather I never really met. My abuelito forgot his own wife and kids but somehow never forgot 1961, the year he became a Bracero to support his family in Mexico. Even when his memories became vague, he would ramble endlessly about the fields and terrains of Orange County. I always subconsciously appreciated that, while he was recalling memories from his past life, it was always while he was wearing a vaquero sombrero and a plaid, button-up, long sleeve. This style was reminiscent of a time when providing for his family meant working hard and long hours.

When I was 12-years-old, my grandfather didn't recognize me anymore, but it didn't hurt as much as one might think. In his eyes, I was a complete stranger, but I was still a person. He had no clue who I was, but he continued to treat me like family. He would insistently offer me food from his own plate whenever we sat at the dinner table together. He didn't care who I was, he just needed to know I wasn't hungry.

On one afternoon while lounging around my grandparent's living room, I got the idea to cut up a phone book into rectangular sheets of paper and pretend it was money.

"¿Que comprarías con este dinero? [What would you buy with this money?]" I asked my abuelito with itching curiosity.

"Un cochino para que mi familia puede comer [A pig so my family can eat]," he replied with a stutter, yet self-assured.

That was the last real conversation I had with my *abuelito* before he passed away. Even on his deathbed, his values remained steadfast. Looking back, I realize he taught me the most important rule in Mexican-American households: always prioritize family. My *abuelito* provided for his loved ones the only way he knew how—through physical labor. Pursuing a post-secondary education, where I will explore my Latinx roots while working toward a college degree, is one step in my journey toward providing for mine. Even though my *abuelito* is not in my life anymore, my relationship with him motivates me every day to push for a better future for myself and my relatives. It's the least I can do to honor the countless sacrifices my *abuelito* and family

made for me. Whenever I feel discouraged about my school work, I think about the proud tears in my mom's eyes when I got into my dream college; I recall the times my dad would tell me that in another universe, he would have been a philosopher, not a factory worker; I think about how hard my *abuelito* worked to put me in my position of privilege. I remember that the obstacles I've overcome as a low-income, first-generation student make me more grateful for my successes.

Recognition by the Vernon CommUNITY Fund would support me in paying for the next 4-6 years of my post-secondary education. Pomona College, which I will be attending next fall, is an incredible, but expensive private institution. That being said, I don't want the price of education to be indicative of my academic achievements. 





I. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Guidelines

The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program focuses on 12th grade students living in the Vernon Area (which includes the cities of Vernon, Maywood, Bell, Huntington Park, Commerce, the area within the City of Los Angeles known as Boyle Heights, and the unincorporated area known as East Los Angeles).

Scholarship Criteria

Vernon Municipal Code ("VMC") Section 2.166(a)(vi) sets forth the specific selection criteria for scholarship recipients and will be the specific standards used to identify qualified applicants who, ultimately, will be recommended as scholarship recipients. Selection criteria have been identified to clearly define the profile of the scholarship recipient.

Many factors will be considered when evaluating scholarship applicants. Scholarship criteria include an applicant's financial need, academic achievement, and the geographic distribution of scholarships. The scholarship criteria support the purpose of the Vernon CommUNITY Fund, which was established to provide charitable contributions in support of improved quality of life, strengthening of families, and affirmation of Vernon's ties with neighboring communities in pursuit of bright futures. The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program was created to provide disadvantaged youth in the Vernon Area the opportunity to achieve success in their post-secondary educational endeavors.

Award Criteria

- Financial need (30 points)
- Community/extracurricular involvement and leadership (30 points)
- Academic achievement (20 points)
- Awards and recognition (10 points)
- Personal and/or family attributes and values (10 points)

Eligibility

12th grade students enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution with full-time status who reside in the Vernon Area (as defined above) may submit an application for a Vernon CommUNITY Fund (VCF) Scholarship.

Specific eligibility standards are identified within this section. In order to be considered for award, applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following detailed criteria:

- · Graduating High School Senior
- Achievement of a Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.0 in high school level coursework for trade school or two-year College applicants; or Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 in high school level coursework for four-year College/University applicants at the time of VCF Scholarship application submission



- Pursuit of a two-year or four-year Degree from accredited College/University; or pursuit of Trade School Certification
- Full-time enrollment at post-secondary educational institution of choice (minimum of 12 units for college) at the time of award
- Immediate transition into a post-secondary educational institution upon graduation from high school (must begin post-secondary coursework within 6 months of graduation)
- Residency in the Vernon Area (U.S. Citizenship is <u>not</u> required); minimum Area residency of 12 months
- Demonstration of strong leadership skills and responsibility (successfully communicated in scholarship application)
- Active in extracurricular activities (i.e., school/community involvement/employment/internship)
- A minimum of 20 hours of community service from 9th grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Not a City of Vernon employee or a legal dependent of a City of Vernon employee, Vernon City-appointed official, or Vernon City-elected official

Application Procedures

The information requested on the application is a reflection of the selection criteria designated for the VCF Scholarship Program. The following question and answer section (Q&A) addresses issues related to the VCF Scholarship application process:

- **Q:** Where and when are scholarship applications available?
- **A:** Beginning on January 1st of each year, applications will be available on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website: www.vernoncommunityfund.org
- **Q:** Where should scholarship applications be submitted?
- A: Students may submit their complete application packages to the Vernon City Hall City Administration Office. Contact information is available on the website if any questions or technical issues arise during the application submission process.
- **Q:** When are scholarship applications due?
- **A:** The Vernon CommUNITY Fund will accept scholarship applications through the last Thursday in March.
- Q: What additional information/documents must accompany the scholarship application?
- As per the eligibility criteria noted above, students must submit proof that they reside and have resided for at least 12 months in the Vernon Area (e.g. utility bills); most recent report card; evidence of GPA with high school transcripts; sworn statement (found on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website in scholarship applicant package) of a teacher or program director/supervisor with knowledge that applicant has performed the minimum amount of community service; and evidence of extracurricular activities. Although not required, students may also include letter(s) of recommendation, and/or letter(s) from post-secondary educational institution(s) along with their scholarship application.



Q: How and when will the scholarship award winners be notified?

A: Scholarship grant applicants recommended for award will be reviewed at the regular VCF Grant Committee meeting in May. Applicants selected for award will be notified within one week of scholarship award via email.

Q: How and when will the scholarship awards be disbursed?

A: Award disbursement will occur in June, with checks directly mailed to scholarship grantees.

The VCF Grant Committee retains the right to withhold scholarship grants in any given year if no candidate is determined to be qualified.

Additional Considerations

- Scholarship amount will be based on applicant competition and funds available for award
- Personal interview of scholarship applicant may or may not be required, and shall be determined after initial review of applicant pool
- Applications may be summarily denied, with or without prior notification to the applicant, if any statements or representations in the application and supporting materials are found to be untruthful, dishonest, or misleading

Selection Procedures

Procedures for selection of award will mirror the current process used for the award of direct service grants and capital grants through the Vernon CommUNITY Fund. The initial evaluation of a scholarship application will be a joint effort amongst City staff and consultant, Jemmott Rollins Group (JRG). Ultimately, the application of any candidate(s) recommended for award will be brought to the Vernon CommUNITY Grant Committee in May for deliberation and approval(s) of grant(s).

The VCF Scholarship Program is designed to benefit a broad class of beneficiaries through an objective process that is nondiscriminatory in nature.



II. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Timeline

A VCF Scholarship Program Timeline has been established based upon the calendar year. In summary, applications are accepted beginning January 1st through the last Thursday in March of a given year. In May, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee will select scholarship grantees. Funds for scholarship awards will be dispersed in June to all scholarship grant recipients.

Structure/Organization

Your essay should give the reader a concise sense of who you are and how your particular life experiences have contributed to your current path. The structure of the essay should support its overall message and convey your personality. The story that you are telling should be logical, with a clear introduction, solid supporting ideas, and a conclusion.



Specific Examples

If you choose to reference life experiences or situations in your essay, they should be specific and not general. Each example that you include in your essay should help showcase your character traits and distinguish you, as an individual, from the other applicants.

Significance

The experiences or situations you include in the essay should address the prompts in a meaningful way. Additionally, they should show significance to your overall message, and lend support to your educational, career, and personal goals.

At a young age, helping others was always something that came naturally to me. When I was younger, my father would arrive home from his job as an HVAC technician with cuts on his fingers, so I eagerly stepped in as his nurse. I would sterilize his wounds and wrap them carefully with bandages. While this might seem like a juvenile reason to choose nursing as my perfect career choice, the examples continued throughout my life. I want to become a nurse because working with others and helping them would make me happy. I am a very social person, and I can use it to my advantage since I have always been in love with the medical field. When I was eight, I told my parents I wanted to be an anesthesiologist, probably not knowing what one did. Now that I am older, it has morphed into nursing with my ultimate goal of becoming a nurse anesthetist. The high school I attend is STEM-focused. I have taken very rigorous math and science courses and have taken every AP class possible. I exhausted all the math offerings by junior year because I took rigorous math courses over the summers to advance.

Although I grew up in a Spanish-speaking home, I have excellent communication and language skills and have taken multiple AP English courses where I scored a four on the exam. I am also fluent and proficient at reading and writing in Spanish and have many years of experience translating documents since my mother speaks and reads only Spanish. Utilizing my strong bilingual skills in the nursing field will benefit others. I have witnessed the divide and struggle between my mother and English-speaking medical professionals. At my current high school in Boyle Heights, I have received the Principal's Honor Roll and the Student Recognition award every semester throughout high school. I am thrilled to have been invited into UCLA's pre-licensure nursing program, with an acceptance rate of only 2%.

My parents are my primary motivation to attend college. Growing up, I noticed how hard they worked and how little they earned. They always mentioned that getting a degree meant that I would work but not as hard as they had to for the little income they made. Whenever there was a choice between public or charter schools, my parents always decided to enroll me in charter school since I would have

better opportunities. Even though my parents did not get a chance to go to college, they've always recognized the importance of obtaining a good education. I would benefit from Vernon Community Scholarship Fund to pay loans, cover personal expenses, travel/commute expenses, housing, etc. Our Expected Family Contribution at \$21,000 is still very unaffordable for my family. I know that I will need additional financial help to attend UCLA.

Although I have had prominent leadership roles, such as Junior Class Vice President and this year's Class President, I have expressed nursing leadership skills with my family. For the past four years, I have taken on a significant role in caring for my brother's children. My brother is in the U.S. Airforce and gets deployed often; I offered my help in taking care of his children. I drive up to Sacramento to watch over my seven-year-old niece and my three-year-old twin nephews. Every summer, it is my job to oversee them while their parents work. I schedule meals, organize bathing routines, play games, and read to them. This past October, I spent the whole month with the children assisting with online school while my sister-in-law worked overnight shifts and my brother was deployed to New York. I needed to organize my time well since I was also managing my academics virtually. Through this experience, I took on a parental caregiving role and gained the trust of my brother and his children.

Right before I left for Sacramento, my father was diagnosed with pre-diabetes. I became quite concerned since he is relatively young at 47 years old. I created a diet for him to lose not only weight but also lower his blood sugar. My father is obese, so I had to find a way for him to eat well and workout in a healthy way that would apply to his specific condition. Before my departure, I set him up on a regimen and checked in with him daily via FaceTime. My father lost 55 pounds in four months and regulated his blood sugar thanks to my positive influence. Taking on these responsibilities has helped me expand my leadership and caretaking skills, directly related to my nursing career choice. I intend to be as motivating, reliable, and compassionate to my future patients as I am with my father and my brother's children.

In March 2019, I was diagnosed with Polycystic Ovarian Syndrome (PCOS). PCOS causes enlarged cystic ovaries, obesity, depression, acne, and hair loss--a laundry list of the worst possible things a teenage girl could experience. Another symptom, infertility, I would be retested for at 18. I proceeded to find comfort through eating, attempting to fill empty and depressed feelings, so getting on a scale became my greatest fear as I watched the numbers grow bigger. During the next five months, I experienced a severe change in myself, not in a healthy way.

In September of that same year, I decided not to allow this disorder to control my life, mentally or physically. I joined Students Run Los Angeles and made it my goal to lose weight and become healthier. I changed my diet by eating fewer carbohydrates and sugar, and soon after, I began running. I started with one mile and gradually increased my mileage. While training, I started losing weight, and as a result, my blood pressure and menstrual cycle regulated. Running was an outlet for me to forget about my worries and allowed me to focus on breathing and letting go. The culmination of my many months of training was running 26.2 miles in the L.A Marathon on March 8th, 2020. After being diagnosed with PCOS, I discovered ways to access support. While I have always enjoyed helping others, I finally had the opportunity to be a successful advocate for myself. The camaraderie I experienced with my new running friends was a great mental benefit to me during this time, but the nurses at the hospital taught me about self-care. They suggested specific diets, gave me helpful resources, and, most importantly, made me feel at ease. My care team's attention to detail, compassion, and bilingual communication are skills that I also share. Having an interest in a medical field career since I was ten, this personal experience solidified nursing as a major for me. My experience also demonstrates my ability to problem solve effectively, which is another quality of an excellent nurse. Now I am certain that I can find practical solutions when faced with future challenges in my nursing education at UCLA and in life. I am grateful for your consideration for this scholarship.

Specific Examples

If you choose to reference life experiences or situations in your essay, they should be specific and not general. Each example that you include in your essay should help showcase your character traits and distinguish you, as an individual, from the other applicants.

Significance

The experiences or situations you include in the essay should address the prompts in a meaningful way. Additionally, they should show significance to your overall message, and lend support to your educational, career, and personal goals.

"Son cosas de hombres," (That's for men) - the haunting criticism to my passions.

Since elementary, I geeked out over computers and anything related to technology. I remember begging my parents to take me to the Apple store every year so that I could interact with their newest technology. It was not until my junior year, that I was truly able to explore the magical field of computer science and enroll in a course. Growing up around many other Latinas in Maywood, California, I expected support for my passions from those who looked like me. Instead, I was disheartened by comments like "Why don't you become a nurse or stay-at-home mom?" and computer science is "too hard" or "not for us." These comments followed me with every error I made and left me to question if there was a place for a brown girl in the field.

Fortunately, my AP Computer Science teacher encouraged me to apply to an all-girls programming course. I was ecstatic to open my acceptance letter, yet on my first day, I was quickly discouraged; I vividly remember having my head on a swivel trying so hard to search for someone who looked like me. In my isolation, feelings of estrangement, hopelessness, intimidation, and shame flooded my head as I worked to complete the program. It was at that moment that I knew I had to embrace my experiences to overcome this travail. I knew that it was up to me to be the change that I not only wanted to see for myself, but for the girls who felt the same as I did.

I realized that my community lacked a fierce Latina leader; someone who could make long-term investments in the Latinas of Maywood, elevate them, and unleash their full potential.

In an effort to develop and harness the potential of the Latinas in Maywood and give them support and acceptance, I founded a community organization called LatinasxTech. I was frustrated by the discouragement of people who looked nothing like me and tired of seeing men idolized for their technological contributions to society. Thus, I created LatinasxTech to empower the brown girls of underserved communities like mine to explore and pursue the field of computer science. Through building

a strong support system of Latinas interested in STEM, my organization works to support every woman so that they do not ever feel like I did when I questioned if brown skin was a curse or if success meant being a few shades lighter. LatinasxTech has already assisted five high school girls in Maywood to explore computer science and is expanding with its social media presence to unite more girls from all over the country. Most recently my organization has been followed and noticed by CBS Tech Expert Jessica Naziri and the NASA Johnson Space Center for the work it's doing to increase diversity in the STEM fields.

My experiences learning computer science and founding LatinasxTech are greatly shaping my future. I plan to attend a 4-year university and pursue a computer science degree with a business minor. With support from the VCF scholarship I will be able to focus on committing to a college that will give me the best computer science education and not have to limit my options due to finances. I will use the VCF scholarship to help me reach my goals of creating a better and accessible world for everyone.

However, I want to go beyond attaining a computer science degree and landing a programming job at a large tech company. One day, I will return to Maywood as an educator to expand the reach and impact of LatinasxTech. My organization will inspire more minority women, who currently only make up two percent of the STEM workforce, by providing personalized resources and working alongside other leaders in my community to implement long-term change. As a high school educator, I intend to advocate for other passionate and dedicated women in my community, work hard to close the gender gap in computer science, and diversify the field. I aspire to be a role model for women of color. It is my goal to have LatinasxTech create the next wave of Latina engineers, computer scientists, programmers, and tech CEOs.

Through my interest in mending gender and racial inequality within my community and computer science, the criticism that once haunted me will have lost its power. By making the investment in my organization and community, my community won't be known for its cruel judgments but for the endless

success stories. For the people who change our world. For the brown girls who dominate the tech industry. For the girl who pushed for change.

I. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Guidelines

The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program focuses on 12th grade students living in the Vernon Area (which includes the cities of Vernon, Maywood, Bell, Huntington Park, Commerce, the area within the City of Los Angeles known as Boyle Heights, and the unincorporated area known as East Los Angeles).

Scholarship Criteria

Vernon Municipal Code ("VMC") Section 2.166(a)(vi) sets forth the specific selection criteria for scholarship recipients and will be the specific standards used to identify qualified applicants who, ultimately, will be recommended as scholarship recipients. Selection criteria have been identified to clearly define the profile of the scholarship recipient.

Many factors will be considered when evaluating scholarship applicants. Scholarship criteria include an applicant's financial need, academic achievement, and the geographic distribution of scholarships. The scholarship criteria support the purpose of the Vernon CommUNITY Fund, which was established to provide charitable contributions in support of improved quality of life, strengthening of families, and affirmation of Vernon's ties with neighboring communities in pursuit of bright futures. The Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program was created to provide disadvantaged youth in the Vernon Area the opportunity to achieve success in their post-secondary educational endeavors.

Award Criteria

- Financial need (30 points)
- Community/extracurricular involvement and leadership (30 points)
- Academic achievement (20 points)
- Awards and recognition (10 points)
- Personal and/or family attributes and values (10 points)

Eligibility

12th grade students enrolling in a post-secondary educational institution with full-time status who reside in the Vernon Area (as defined above) may submit an application for a Vernon CommUNITY Fund (VCF) Scholarship.

Specific eligibility standards are identified within this section. In order to be considered for award, applicants must meet <u>all</u> of the following detailed criteria:

- · Graduating High School Senior
- Achievement of a Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.0 in high school level coursework for trade school or two-year College applicants; or Minimum Weighted Grade Point Average of 2.5 in high school level coursework for four-year College/University applicants at the time of VCF Scholarship application submission



- Pursuit of a two-year or four-year Degree from accredited College/University; or pursuit of Trade School Certification
- Full-time enrollment at post-secondary educational institution of choice (minimum of 12 units for college) at the time of award
- Immediate transition into a post-secondary educational institution upon graduation from high school (must begin post-secondary coursework within 6 months of graduation)
- Residency in the Vernon Area (U.S. Citizenship is <u>not</u> required); minimum Area residency of 12 months
- Demonstration of strong leadership skills and responsibility (successfully communicated in scholarship application)
- Active in extracurricular activities (i.e., school/community involvement/employment/internship)
- A minimum of 20 hours of community service from 9th grade to first semester of 12th grade
- Not a City of Vernon employee or a legal dependent of a City of Vernon employee, Vernon City-appointed official, or Vernon City-elected official

Application Procedures

The information requested on the application is a reflection of the selection criteria designated for the VCF Scholarship Program. The following question and answer section (Q&A) addresses issues related to the VCF Scholarship application process:

- **Q:** Where and when are scholarship applications available?
- **A:** Beginning on January 1st of each year, applications will be available on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website: www.vernoncommunityfund.org
- **Q:** Where should scholarship applications be submitted?
- A: Students may submit their complete application packages to the Vernon City Hall City Administration Office. Contact information is available on the website if any questions or technical issues arise during the application submission process.
- **Q:** When are scholarship applications due?
- **A:** The Vernon CommUNITY Fund will accept scholarship applications through the last Thursday in March.
- Q: What additional information/documents must accompany the scholarship application?
- As per the eligibility criteria noted above, students must submit proof that they reside and have resided for at least 12 months in the Vernon Area (e.g. utility bills); most recent report card; evidence of GPA with high school transcripts; sworn statement (found on the Vernon CommUNITY Fund website in scholarship applicant package) of a teacher or program director/supervisor with knowledge that applicant has performed the minimum amount of community service; and evidence of extracurricular activities. Although not required, students may also include letter(s) of recommendation, and/or letter(s) from post-secondary educational institution(s) along with their scholarship application.



Q: How and when will the scholarship award winners be notified?

A: Scholarship grant applicants recommended for award will be reviewed at the regular VCF Grant Committee meeting in May. Applicants selected for award will be notified within one week of scholarship award via email.

Q: How and when will the scholarship awards be disbursed?

A: Award disbursement will occur in June, with checks directly mailed to scholarship grantees.

The VCF Grant Committee retains the right to withhold scholarship grants in any given year if no candidate is determined to be qualified.

Additional Considerations

- Scholarship amount will be based on applicant competition and funds available for award
- Personal interview of scholarship applicant may or may not be required, and shall be determined after initial review of applicant pool
- Applications may be summarily denied, with or without prior notification to the applicant, if any statements or representations in the application and supporting materials are found to be untruthful, dishonest, or misleading

Selection Procedures

Procedures for selection of award will mirror the current process used for the award of direct service grants and capital grants through the Vernon CommUNITY Fund. The initial evaluation of a scholarship application will be a joint effort amongst City staff and consultant, Jemmott Rollins Group (JRG). Ultimately, the application of any candidate(s) recommended for award will be brought to the Vernon CommUNITY Grant Committee in May for deliberation and approval(s) of grant(s).

The VCF Scholarship Program is designed to benefit a broad class of beneficiaries through an objective process that is nondiscriminatory in nature.



II. Vernon CommUNITY Fund Scholarship Program Timeline

A VCF Scholarship Program Timeline has been established based upon the calendar year. In summary, applications are accepted beginning January 1st through the last Thursday in March of a given year. In May, the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee will select scholarship grantees. Funds for scholarship awards will be dispersed in June to all scholarship grant recipients.

January – March

Review of candidate applications to determine recommended grant awards for VCF Grant Committee approval

Approval of VCF Scholarship Grant Awards at the regular May VCF Grant Committee Meeting (held on the 3^{rd} Wednesday in May at 10:00 a.m.)

VCF Scholarship Grant Awards are processed for payment

Specific Examples

If you choose to reference life experiences or situations in your essay, they should be specific and not general. Each example that you include in your essay should help showcase your character traits and distinguish you, as an individual, from the other applicants.

Significance

The experiences or situations you include in the essay should address the prompts in a meaningful way. Additionally, they should show significance to your overall message, and lend support to your educational, career, and personal goals.







SUBJECT

Vernon CommUNITY Fund Allocation and Recommendations for Fiscal Year 2021/2022

Recommendation:

Discuss the anticipated Vernon CommUNITY Fund grantmaking program allocation for fiscal year 2021/2022, and provide recommendations to staff for grantmaking in the upcoming fiscal year.

Background:

The City Council created the Vernon CommUNITY Fund ("VCF") to provide grants to charitable and governmental entities for projects and programs that benefit those residing and working in Vernon and, on February 4, 2014, the City Council established the Vernon CommUNITY Fund Grant Committee ("Grant Committee"), providing the basic guidelines and operational procedures for said Committee and its officers, including those related to the allocation of funds and the processes for reviewing and ranking applications and awarding grants. The VCF highlights the City's commitment to be a good neighbor to the Southeast Los Angeles region and upholds its responsibility to good governance and service to the community.

Pursuant to Vernon Municipal Code Section 2.164, the City Council may appropriate funds to the VCF. Through the normal budgetary process, City Council may authorize an amount to the VCF. For fiscal year ("FY") 2021/2022 which begins on July 1, 2021, staff will be recommending an allocation of \$500,000.

Administrative Costs shall be determined for the fiscal year and the amount shall be allocated for payment from funds appropriated to the VCF.

After \$106,675 for administrative costs associated to grant management, tracking, and applicant evaluation, the remaining amount available for Vernon CommUNITY Fund grantmaking would be \$393,325. In the previous fiscal year, staff recommended (and the Grant Committee approved) a breakdown of the VCF allocation as follows:

- * 95% for direct service grants (\$373,325)
- * 5% for scholarship grants (\$20,000)

The Grant Committee has full discretion to advise on their preferred breakdown of the grant allocation, and may adjust or modify the blueprint for the new fiscal year as they see fit. For example, if there is a consensus on the Grant Committee to increase the percentage of grant funds available for the VCF Scholarship Program, the Grant Committee may make a recommendation to staff accordingly. Likewise, if there is consensus among Grant Committee Members to pursue non-profit organization grant applicants with a particular focus or offering for the Vernon Area, recommendations may be provided to staff.

Meeting dates for the Grant Committee will continue to occur in May and November, with direct service grants to be considered for deliberation at the November meeting, and scholarship grants to be considered at the May meeting. The restructuring to two meetings per year has served the VCF well, allowing for a reduction in year-round grant activities performed, thereby simplifying VCF grant program management. The VCF model requires proportional administration to the fiscal year allocation, and ensures alignment with grantmaker best practices to streamline internal operations and administrative costs. As a result, VCF grant dollars continue to be maximized to positively impact the Vernon Area.
